We absolutely love this time of year in school. There are so many opportunities for the community to come together and celebrate the children's achievements and support their learning. This week was no exception with the Friends of Dallam Summer Fayre yesterday. Once again, the weather was on our side as staff and children worked tirelessly all morning to set up stalls and get the field ready. It was lovely to see so many parents and friends of the school supporting us. As usual, the queue for the tombola was very long with everyone waiting patiently for their turn. There were quite a few bags clinking with bottles as people left at the end of the afternoon! The coconut shy ran out of coconuts towards the end and the bouncy castles were extremely well attended despite the warm weather. There was an absolutely lovely atmosphere on the field as families mingled. The smell of hot dogs and candy floss provided a mouthwatering backdrop to Splat the Rat, Balloon Pop and Water or Wine stalls. My favourite part of the afternoon was seeing the smiles on the faces of our children whatever they were doing. All of the proceeds from Friends of Dallam's Children events are used to support the provision of experiences and resources that school would not otherwise be able to provide. We are extremely grateful for the hours of work that they dedicate to the school and for the support of families and friends at their events.

This week, it has been Cherry Class's turn to be out and about in the community. They have travelled to Meadowside Primary's musical performance where they had a brilliant time. They watched their pupils singing and dancing: including a wide range of songs from classic shows like Annie and hits by Abba. As usual our children were impeccably behaved and really supported Meadowside's children by listening well, clapping and cheering loudly! Back in the classroom, they explored foods which the Ancient Greeks may have eaten as part of their learning in history. They sampled honey, pitta, olives, dolmades and feta and evaluated them as snacks. Understandably, there was a wide variety of responses from "delicious" to "eurgh!" They then used their food technology skills to make tzatziki dip which went down well.

Around school, it's that time of year when children and staff are excited about their classes for next year. Some children have already started spending a little time with their new class team to make sure that the transition goes as well as possible. The whole school will have a week of transition starting on Monday 21st July. We find that this really helps children to understand the routines and expectations of their next class before we break up and therefore helps everyone to relax over the summer. It also makes sure that teachers are absolutely ready to start the first day back in September with purposeful, focused learning that is pitched at the right level for all children. The last week of term is really important for these transitions, so it is vital that your child is in school, on time, every day.
