

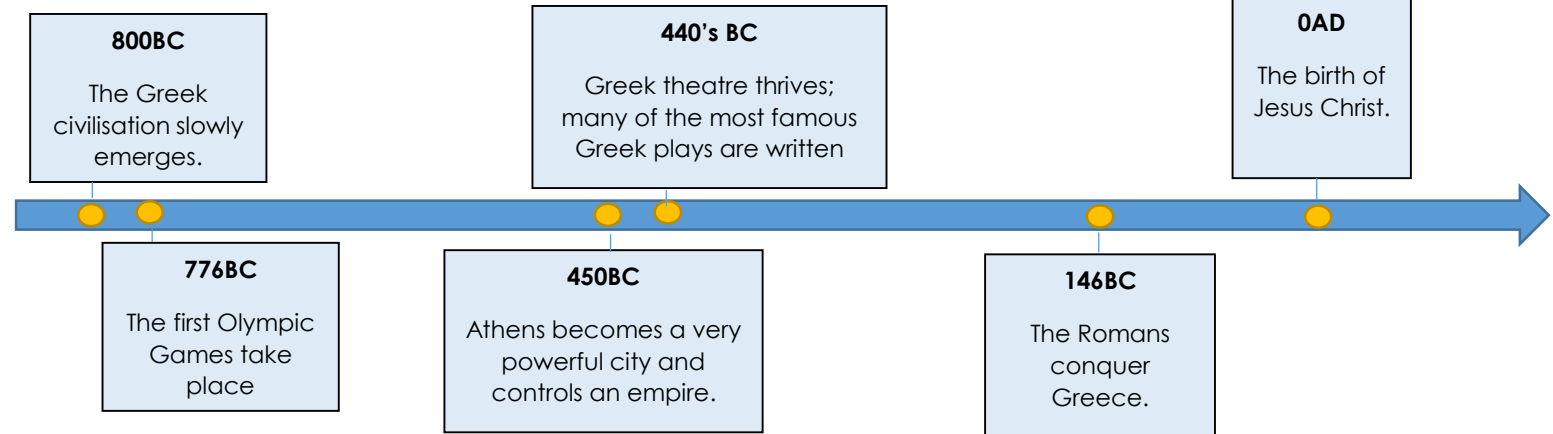

Key Dates

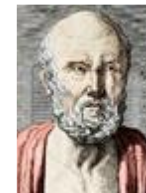
- **800BC**- The Greek civilization slowly began to emerge.

- The Ancient Greeks lived about 3,000 years ago.
- Ancient Greece was not a single country but was made up of many city states. The most famous are: Athens, Sparta and Corinth.
- Athens first introduced the world to the idea of a true democracy. Citizens were allowed to vote for their leaders and on new laws
- One of the favourite forms of entertainment was the theatre; they introduced the ideas of the comedy and the tragedy.
- The ancient Greeks were fierce competitors; they invented the Olympic Games.

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
