## Online Safety

Earlier in the year, we invited Emma Mills, the Headteacher at Birchwood Community High School, to talk to parents about keeping our children safe online. There has been a great deal in the media recently about this issue and I know that the parents who attended the presentation found it very useful but also very worrying. I am incredibly pleased and relieved that Warrington has become one of very few places in the country to offer **every parent free access to the Smoothwall Online Safety Hub** — an incredible resource designed to help families monitor and manage online activity. Please read the attached letter which provides more information about this and an incredible opportunity to receive free access to an online safety app which will help you to support your child to develop safe online skills.

### **School Uniform**

The children always look so smart and prepared for the summer temperatures in their summer uniforms this term. Please make sure that your child has a cardigan or sweatshirt for the cooler days and double check that they have their name in all their clothing. This is the time of year when most cardigans and sweatshirts are left on the playground and field and reuniting them with their owners can be extremely challenging!

As the year goes on, we always see more trainers being worn for school. Please remember that the **school uniform includes black school shoes**. Trainers are not permitted to be worn all day. If your child is not wearing school shoes or sandals, their teacher will speak to them and/or you about it.

If your child has school shoes, but is reluctant to wear them, talk to us about it – we may be able to help. Equally if there is any other reason why your child is not wearing school shoes – talk to your child's teacher or Mrs Wilson – again, we may be able to help. We have a selection of new school shoes in a variety of sizes which could be just what you need.

Finally, our PE kit is part of our school uniform – this is the time when children SHOULD wear trainers! The PE uniform polo is Dallam blue – not white. This helps us to make sure that children are changing correctly for physical exercise and developing those good habits moving forward. Please make sure that your child has a Dallam blue PE top as part of their PE kit.
