The main event this week has been the Key Stage 2 SATs which Oak Class have taken. There were a total of 6 tests spread over 4 days and as usual they were pretty challenging in parts. Every last one of our children was absolutely amazing; they arrived in school eager to do their very, very best and faced the challenge with confidence, determination and focus. It was such a pleasure to watch as they absolutely smashed it! The children have been preparing for this week for a couple of months so they knew exactly what to expect and how to do their best in each test. I want to say a huge thank you to the teachers and teaching assistants right through school who have supported our children to be ready to take on their next big challenge as they move on to high school at the end of this year. We are all so incredibly proud of them, as I know you must be too.

Elsewhere in school, our exciting curriculum has continued to provide inspirational experiences for the children. Olive Class had a brilliant time when they visited Padgate Academy to take part in a Forensic Science experience. They used chromatography paper to discover which ink matched the pen used by the culprit and studied their own fingerprints before matching other people's fingerprints to find a suspect. The children loved learning in a high school science classroom which is very different to primary school! As always, the children's behaviour and attitudes were fantastic – they made such a good first impression with the staff from Padgate – they were full of praise for their problem solving and excellent co-operation skills.

Rowan Class also represented school fantastically on Tuesday when they took part in the official opening ceremony of the new Family Hub next to school. They sang a part of Papageno's Aria from the opera The Magic Flute by Mozart. Papageno is a character who is half man, half bird who is helping the prince in the story to find his true love. The children have learned about this in class and really enjoy singing it. There were dignitaries from Warrington council present and they were blown away by the performance which was full of energy and joy. Earlier in the morning, children from Ash Class had also been to visit where they loved meeting Wolfie and playing in the outdoor area. It's been a brilliant week in school with the sunshine making sure that all classes were able to make the most of learning outside. Fingers crossed that it lasts through next week as well!
