As usual, there has been a range of creative and fun ways for the children to develop their knowledge and skills this week. Tuesday was a very important day – especially in EYFS where our children learned lots about bees because it was World Bee Day! The fun and creativity lasted all week as the children enjoyed completing lots of bee related activities. They made peg bees with lots of craft materials; pinecone bees by threading yellow wool around pinecones; used their excellent counting skills to solve bee addition calculations and produced some fabulous bee writing. When I popped into class there was a real buzz of activity and the children were able to talk to me about the vital role that these tiny insects play in fruit production. Undoubtably though, the highlight of the week was the visit from Julia the bee lady. Ash Class, Acorns and Saplings learned a great deal more about bees as they explored a beehive; looked closely at honeycomb; felt bees wax and tried on protective clothing worn by beekeepers. What a brilliant week's work! It will really help your child to remember their learning over time if you encourage them to tell you about it. That way, when they come back to build on this week's knowledge and understanding in the future, they will be able to recall it easily.

Again, on Tuesday, a group of children from Maple and Sycamore Classes went for an exciting day at Meadowside Primary School where they took part in a maths day with five other schools from across Warrington. Mrs Large, who led the learning, made maths fun and exciting. The children used origami to explore triangles and now know how to tell if even the biggest of numbers is divisible by three. The best part of the day was playing the "24 game" which made the children's brains work super hard as they found different ways to make 24 using 4 single digits. The children had a great time and were an absolute credit to our school and their families. Mrs Carrothers went with them and was so incredibly proud of their maths skills and attitude to learning – she can't wait for next time!

On Thursday, Cherry Class had a great time taking part in a panathlon challenge at Orford Hub. There was a wide range of sports including archery, kurling, tennis and long jump. The children had a brilliant time, trying the activities and competing against each other and participants from several other Warrington schools. They all received a medal at the end to celebrate their fantastic sporting attitudes and returned to school tired but happy!

Now that their SATs are over, Year 6 children are turning their attention to their end of year leavers' assembly. They've chosen the play themselves and have been auditioning for parts this week. I spotted them leaving school with their scripts yesterday – ready to start learning their lines. I'm looking forward to hearing them practise their songs and perfecting their performance over the coming weeks – ready to wow us with their final show on 17th July. I can't wait!

This morning Cedar Class shared their learning with the rest of the school and their parents and carers. They were absolutely amazing! The range of different subjects that they learn is truly impressive and it was clear to see how they build on this for their future learning. It was so lovely to see the children's obvious enjoyment and pride in their work and I was blown away by the confident speaking and microphone skills. The children had learned their parts and delivered them brilliantly. It was also great to see how many parents and carers came to watch the assembly. The children love it when they share their school experiences with you. Well done Cedar Class we are all so very proud of you!

Have a lovely two-week holiday – we will see you on Monday 9th June for the last half term of this school year.
