The highlight of my week has to be the Early Years sports days on Wednesday. They were absolutely brilliant. Seeing our 2, 3 and 4 year olds taking part in the events, filled me with so much pride: it absolutely embodied our school mission statement of "Success at the Heart of Our Community".

In EYFS our children are laying the foundations for future success. These earliest years in education are arguably their most important as they develop the personal, social and practical skills to build on for the rest of their lives. It was lovely to see how the children's confidence and physical skills progress from 2 to 4 years old and really fantastic to see how our amazing staff make adjustments to enable every child to take part.

The events were organised by Mrs Wooster, our very enthusiastic and dedicated PE lead and Tom, our inspirational sports coach. This year, they were determined that our very youngest children would experience a sports day that begins to prepare them to excel in Key Stages 1 and 2 and, as you saw, with the support of the staff across EYFS and beyond, they succeeded.

There were so many positives to take away from the day, but the over-riding one for me was watching our upper junior Sports Crew supporting the youngest members of their school community. We aim to equip our children with confidence, initiative and kindness and this was evident in everything that they did. Mrs Wooster and Tom have developed a programme to enable children to take on leadership opportunities through Sports Crew throughout the year. They support our younger children at lunch time and in after school clubs; teaching them new games and promoting our values of respect, resilience, inclusivity, ambition, honesty and kindness. Five of the Year 6 Sports Crew have given up their own time after school all year to support Tom's multi-skills and racket skills clubs for KS1! I could not have been more proud seeing our youngest and oldest children working together so beautifully.

A close second was seeing the delight on the children's faces when the spotted their family members and carers in the crowd – they absolutely love to share their school experiences with the people they love. Thank you so much for coming to share the events – I don't think that I have ever seen such a well attended sports day – we all really appreciate your support.

Mrs Wooster and Ash Class have had a very busy week. As well as sports day they have been on 2 trips this week! One to Warrington Museum, where they had a story time with a story teller. Mrs Wooster said that they were absolutely enthralled by the event. The children I spoke to when they returned to school were equally impressed by the bus ride into Town and the picnic they had in Palmyra Square! The other trip was to the World Museum in Liverpool to support their learning about the world we live in – particularly the animals that live in the sea and the impact of our actions on the environment. The visits were very much enjoyed by all and would not have been possible without the support of the volunteers who accompanied them – thank you.

In the juniors, Sycamore Class have also been on a visit to Nell Bank on the edge of the Yorkshire Dales. It was a very long day, packed with learning – from field work and exploring the River Wharfe to orienteering and time to play on a huge adventure playground. The children told me that the playground was so good that the teachers couldn't resist having a go too!

We have enjoyed great weather this week. We are making sure that the children drink plenty of water in school and do not overheat. Please make sure that they have their water bottle in school every day, sun cream applied in the morning and a cap or hat to protect them in the sun.
