As the weeks go by this half term, they just seem to get better and better! This week I had the absolute privilege of accompanying the choir to the Parr Hall on Tuesday evening for the TCAT Performs event. The theme was Excellence in the Arts and it was certainly an excellent event. Our children were fantastic! They coped amazingly well with last minute changes to their routine and absolutely smashed it. The highlight of the evening for me was seeing their delight as they listened to the cheers and applause from the thousand strong audience. The other TCAT academies all gave stunning performances which inspired our choir: they could see some of the opportunities that await them as they move to high school and maybe on to Priestley College. As usual, the behaviour and attitudes of our children was exemplary despite it being a late night and hot in the theatre. It was fabulous to see so many parents and carers supporting the children – I know that you must have been as proud of them as we were.

This was followed by KS1 and KS2 sports day on Wednesday which were both absolutely lovely events. It was so great to see how truly inclusive our school is: all children were able to take part and encouraged each other to do their very best. One of our school values is resilience and this was really evident every time a child found a race challenging but carried on right to the end without giving up. Once again our Sports Crew were amazing; making sure that equipment was where it needed to be and younger children were supported to take part.

What I noticed on Wednesday was how the children's skills develop as they move through the school. Some of the javelin throws were truly impressive and you can clearly see the children's techniques in running and throwing progressing. As Year 6 move on to high school, I hope that they continue to nurture their sporting talents. I'd love to see some champions of the future among them.

Again, the events were incredibly well supported by parents and carers. This means so much to the children – they absolutely love sharing their school experiences with you. On Thursday morning, our Year 5 and 6 children took part in the Road to Glasgow event at the Orford Hub. This celebration kicks off the build up to the Commonwealth Games in the summer of 2026 for Warrington's primary school children. There were other schools present and the children were split into groups to take part in different events that they may or may not have experienced before including: tri-golf, lacrosse, cricket and quad kids. Again, our children were an absolute credit to themselves, the school and their families: demonstrating great sporting behaviour and resilience.

Thursday's learning started with Maple Class's podcast which was broadcast over the school Tannoy. The theme was "What Have We Done to Make Us Feel Proud" Every single child in the class made a contribution – listening to their confident speaking, inspirational curriculum and evident enjoyment of their learning made me feel incredibly proud of them and their teachers. I popped down to class after the broadcast and the children were bursting with pride having heard themselves presenting to their audience. We are in the process of updating all the podcasts from this year on our website. They can be found under School Life – Dallam People. If you keep checking in over the next couple of weeks, you can catch up with all the podcasts so far this year as they upload. They are well worth a listen.

I'd like to give a huge shout out to all the staff who really do go above and beyond to make these opportunities and experiences happen for our children. Without them volunteering their time (sometimes late into the night) and energy to plan, organise and support these activities, they would not be able to take place. Another reason for me to feel proud today!
