I went into Ash Class's outdoor area yesterday and was super impressed with the sensible way that the children were applying their sunscreen ready for a morning of learning in the fresh air and sunshine. It's really important for them to learn how to be safe in the sun and their teachers are building this into every day at the moment.

In school, we are taking particular care to keep our rooms as cool as possible by keeping blinds closed, lights off and windows open. We are encouraging the children to enjoy quiet times and drink plenty of water as well as seeking out shade and protecting themselves from the sun while they are outside. Please make sure that your child has a water bottle and hat with them in school and apply suncream before they leave home in the morning. (don't forget noses and ears as they often catch the sun first!)

Maple and Willow Class have especially enjoyed visiting the baths for their swimming lesson this week. They have made so much progress that they were rewarded with a fun and floats session – what a great way to keep cool! It was lovely to see the children's faces as they enjoyed games in the pool, using the swimming skills they've developed this term. They also supported each other beautifully, taking turns with the equipment, helping each other to get onto the floats and then pushing them for each other. Their teachers were all really proud of them.

As the weather heats up, it is very tempting for our young people to cool down in our water ways. Tragically, every year we hear news stories about children who have got into trouble – sometimes with catastrophic results. In classes, we are sharing Cheshire Fire and Rescue's water safety messages over the next week or so. I've included the advice that they've asked me to share with the school community below.

Yesterday, in Holly and Hazel, the children had great fun working together towards a common goal! They prepared food (sandwiches, biscuits, cakes and fruit) for themselves and their friends. They worked on good hygiene skills (washing their hands before and after preparing food and keeping their fingers out of their mouths and noses!) They also developed their cooking safety skills when using sharp (child safe) knives and showed fantastic turn taking skills.

Once all that hard work was completed, the children enjoyed the really fun part – a Teddy bears picnic in the school hall! They absolutely loved trying the different foods – even the teddies tried a bit! There was singing, team games with Tom, our PE coach, and a fabulous action story about some missing bears to complete the afternoon. What a brilliant way to celebrate national Teddy Bears Picnic Day! Last week the children had a visit from Trudi Colbourne, from Livewire. She came into assembly to tell us about The Summer Reading Challenge 2025 that launched on 5th July. She has invited children to head down to any of Warrington's Libraries and sign up. By reading one book a week, children can earn some super prizes. There are stickers, a bookmark, a fairy door and even a medal to be won! The theme is 'Story Garden' exploring adventures in nature and the great outdoors. She is also giving a prize to the school that has the largest percentage of children entering the Summer Reading Challenge - so let's get signing up!

Today all children should be bringing a book home from the Bookfair. We have managed to secure this opportunity for the children through our association with the Bookmark charity and Scholastic books. We still can't quite believe their generosity in providing a free book each for our children and are extremely grateful. What a great way to start the summer and promote the love of reading that we are so keen to develop in our children.

Stay safe this summer

Whether you're staying at home or going on holiday this summer, make sure you are being safe in and around the water.

What to do if you see someone in trouble

Shout – "Are you in trouble? Can you swim towards me, or stand up?"

Reach – find a long object that you can let go of, to try and reach the person. Lie down or crouch so you aren't pulled in too.

Throw – throw something to help keep them afloat - throwlines (floating lines), footballs, and life rings are great options.

Don't go – Never go into the water yourself; keep eyes on them and call 999 immediately.

If you're in trouble, Float to Live - lie on your back, keeping your mouth above the surface, and try to gently move to safety. Stay calm.
