It really feels as though autumn has arrived this week: despite the sometimes sunny days, there has been a definite nip in the air. We enjoy outdoor playtimes in all but the very worst weather, so please make sure that your child has a warm waterproof coat in school every day as autumn really begins to take hold. Don't forget that we have some great, pre-loved coats in the school reception area that you are welcome to take for your children. If you have any warm coats that you child has grown out of, please consider donating them to extend their usefulness. This not only is great for reducing landfill, but will also help our community in these challenging financial times.

We started the week with an assembly to explore our school values – particularly our focus for this half term: respect. The children suggested lots of ways that they can show respect to themselves, other people and environments in school, at home and in the community. If your child is making an extra effort to show respect out of school, please let us know – it's important to us that they demonstrate our core values of respect, resilience, kindness, ambition, inclusivity and honesty in all aspects of their lives. We will continue to return to this theme throughout the half term.

In school the children are enjoying their new units of work and it feels as though we've been back for weeks as I visit the classrooms. I can really see the benefit of getting to know the new staff team and routines before we break up for the summer. The children have returned with confidence and eager to learn. Ash Class have completed their first full week at school - I'm sure they will all sleep well tonight after a busy week learning and catching up with their friends! Our new Key Stage 1 children in Cedar, Holly and Hazel Classes have been making their teachers proud everyday as they have demonstrated fabulous listening skills and great co-operation with each other as they share their ideas in lessons and play together at playtime.

Our new Key Stage 2 children in Maple and Willow Classes are definitely ready to be juniors. When I've popped into their classrooms, I have been super impressed by the calm quiet learning environments and the focus of the children on their work. Finally our new Year 6 children in Oak and Cherry Classes have absolutely risen to the challenge of their final year at primary school. They are already demonstrating independence, enthusiasm and confidence as they begin to build the knowledge and skills they will need next year at high school. Equally as important, they are great role models for the younger children in school. The way that they manage themselves in all parts of the school environment has been exemplary.

Your child should have brought home their project letter this week which contains information about what they will be learning for the next term. Try to take a moment this weekend to talk to your child about what they have enjoyed learning this week and what they are looking forward to next week. Every moment of every day is filled with learning opportunities, so if they say they are looking forward to playtime – that's fine! This is where

we guide children to develop their social skills and self-regulation strategies whist fitting in a bit of physical activity.

Next Wednesday at lunch time, children in Year 5 and 6 are invited to football trials, with Tom, for the school team. If your child wants to try out, they may want to get a bit of extra practice in over the weekend. We will also be electing our new school councillors and Happiness Heroes and selecting Y5 Play Leaders next week. These are positions of leadership and responsibility that many of our KS2 children aspire to. If your child wants to put themself forward, it may help them if you talk to them about how they could represent their class by listening to their peers and sharing their thoughts and ideas or about the skills and attributes they demonstrate to be a good Play Leader such as: great listening, patience and fairness.

On Tuesday, Mrs Best reached an amazing milestone in her partnership with Dallam Primary. She has worked with and supported the children, families and staff at the school for 40 years! This truly is an achievement and I'm sure that you will join with me in saying a huge thank you for her dedication, sense of humour and care in her many different roles – all of which help us to provide the safe, purposeful and nurturing ethos that we are all so proud of.
