This Thursday was World Poetry Day so children across the school have been learning poems and rhymes around the theme of "Play". We had an assembly in the morning where the children shared their performances with the rest of the school: it was fantastic! From Ash Class who gave a fantastic rendition of 5 Little Monkeys which they have been learning, not only to support their oracy skills but also their early maths: to Maple Class who performed a poem about successful women in sport with great actions: to Sycamore Class who organised themselves to perform a very thought provoking poem highlighting that all children around the world have a right to play, the performances were polished and engaging. It was fabulous to see how each class had interpreted the theme. Olive Class performed a call and response poem which was based on "a play on words" which was humorous and very thought provoking while Oak Class gave an amazing choral performance which truly sparked the imagination and built pictures in the mind of children using items from around the house to build an imaginary boat and ride the waves. Cedar Class were really proud of their poem which they wrote themselves based on the games that they play on the playground and Rowan and Willow Classes used Makaton to communicate the messages in their poems integrated into their excellent performances.

The children really enjoyed performing for each other: the progression from Reception to Year 6 was clearly evident. Our children are developing independence, confidence and a love of performing as they move through school. The high expectations of staff in classrooms supports them to achieve their very best in line with our school vision: Nurture, Inspire, Achieve.

It has been lovely to see parents and carers in school for the first of our drop-ins of the year. The children really love it when their adults come into school to share their experiences with them. They are incredibly proud of their work and their classrooms and like people from home to see what they are like. We have lots more drop-ins next week – I really hope that you can make them.

Olive Class have been working with BikeRight this week to develop their cycling skills even further. They have learned how to safety check their bike before riding and about the importance of wearing the correct safety equipment to prevent injury. They have been supported to ride with control and confidence and to navigate the roads where appropriate. Our children really look forward to these sessions and have had great success this year.

I had a surprise visitor in my office after school on Thursday. Three children from gardening club were extremely excited to have found a newt while they have been preparing our beds for winter. They brought it to see me very carefully before returning it to its natural habitat. Our pond area has grown into a haven for wildlife – we are so pleased that we

have such diversity in our grounds. I think the thing that impressed me the most was that the children were able to tell me that a newt is an amphibian! I hope you have a lovely weekend.
