It is so different to when many parents and carers were at school – our teachers work incredibly hard to make sure that the children are happy, confident, and independent in their learning.

Here is a small taster of some of the other fantastic things children have been learning this week:

Hazel class have been learning about Harvest festival this week. They baked their own bread shaped as hedgehogs. The children were excited to see the difference in the bread once it came out of the oven. They enjoyed eating their bread with some butter.

Cedar Class welcomed parents and carers into school on Wednesday to share the wonderful learning that has been happening so far this year. They enjoyed building some very tall stable towers, investigating waterproof materials, locating places on a map, colour mixing, making bird feeders and there was even time for Autumn soup!

Willow class have been exploring evaporation in science. The children poured water onto the playground and drew around it with chalk. When they returned outside for playtime some of the water puddles had shrunk and some had disappeared altogether. The children were brilliant explaining what had happened.

Four children from year 5 and 6 took part in an Aim Higher writing workshop with the author Damien Harvey. The children were allowed to explore their own creativity and plan and write their own story. As always, their behaviour was exemplary, and their writing was truly amazing!

Holly Class have been listening to a song about going to the moon in maths and have decided they want to go to the moon! So today, they decided to make rockets to help them get there! They used lots of junk modelling, using cutting and attaching skills to make rockets.
They had the best time!

Phones in school.

Children in Year 5 & 6 are allowed to bring their mobile phones into school. But they must be handed in to the school office before registration and locked away, then collected at the end of the day. It is the child's responsibility to remember to collect from the office at the end of the day.

Medical and dental appointments during school time.

Attending a medical or dental appointment will be counted as authorised as long as the pupil's parent notifies the school in advance of the appointment and show evidence of it, this could be an appointment card, text or letter to be given the school office. However, we encourage parents to make medical and dental appointments out of school hours where possible. Where this is not possible, the pupil should be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary.
