I can't believe that it's dark when I get up in the morning again! As the days are getting shorter and more and more leaves are falling off the trees, it's a good time remember. Children in Year 1 will be learning about deciduous and evergreen shrubs and trees and Year 5 will be learning about the movement of the Earth in space and how this affects the length of daylight hours as the season change. I've spotted lots of children having a great time exploring the texture and appearance of pumpkins, conkers, autumn leaves and acorns in our youngest children's classrooms as they learn more about some of the features of the season.

In all classes across school, the children are really enjoying their learning. Cherry Class have had a great time baking biscuits as part of their design technology learning. They worked very hard to read and follow a recipe – being careful to measure accurately and follow the steps in the right order. Mrs Rich will agree that the best part of the lesson was the very end where the tasting took place. They were delicious! After half term, the children will have the opportunity to adjust the recipe to make it even better then bake more biscuits to compare with the ones they've made this week – definitely something to look forward to!

Rowan Class were creating maps of Dallam in art this week. They drew their journey to school and then used this to create a 3D map. They used materials such as cardboard, string, foil, newspaper, felt, tissue paper and card. The children used their observational skills to cut out shapes that matched their maps and used landmarks such as roundabouts and parks. They did an amazing job.

Holly class have been learning about season & the Harvest festival. They saw the apples on the tree outside school and decided to made Apple pies and share them with their families. They were delicious!!

Hazel class joined Acorns and Seedlings on Thursday on a trip to the KS2 playground to see a fire engine. The children got a tour round the fire engine, tried on some uniform, and even had a go of the fire hose. They were recapping their learning from last year about Frank Bailey the first Black firefighter as part of Black History Month.

Olive Class have been working on their measuring, marking and cutting skills in DT to design and make a bridge. They showed huge amounts of resilience because of the amount of wood they had to cut!

As part of their art lesson, Oak Class had to use photography to recreate famous paintings using everyday objects and themselves. They worked in teams and used their creative thinking skills and produced some amazing results.

Next week, all the classes will be completing work in their current units before they move on after half term. It's really important that the children are in school every day so that they can come back after the holiday ready to build on what they know and understand.

Safeguarding Matters

As you know, safeguarding is our number one priority in school – every member of staff is committed to keeping our children safe and happy in school.

With this in mind, please don't be offended if I, or another member of staff, ask you to put your phone away whilst you are on the school site. Staff do not use their phones when the children are present and some parents and carers are uncomfortable about the potential to take photos which their children may be included in either intentionally or unintentionally.

Likewise, please remind your child to push their bike or scooter across the playground and carpark at drop off and pick up. There have been a couple of near misses involving children riding across the playground where much younger children are walking with their parents and carers.

The education team at the local authority have been made aware by the police of reports of individuals acting suspiciously in the Warrington area, speaking to children and attempting to entice them into their cars. The advice to schools and parents is to remind children and young people about the possible dangers of speaking to strangers and report any suspicious incidents to the police.
