It was an early start and late finish to the day for staff and children alike – but sooooo worth it: not even Storm Benjamin could dampen their spirits. On their return, the children were absolutely buzzing about the sights and sounds of the opera and their walk around London – they even treated me to a bit of opera singing of their own!

As we break up for half term, we also say goodbye to a much loved member of staff. Mrs Leffler is going to pursue her dreams at Warrington & Vale Royal College where she is going to share her extensive knowledge of Early Years Education with the next generation of teaching assistants. We will really miss her after 8 years of dedicated service to the children and families of Dallam, but wish her well in her next adventure. When we return after the holiday, we are welcoming Miss Sherwood into our Dallam family as Nursery teacher.
