It was great to see the children enjoying themselves playing party games, dancing and socialising with their friends.

Again this year, the staff have asked me to thank parents at pick up time. Making sure that the right children go with the right adults is our biggest challenge of the evening. Your patience and the orderly way that you waited meant that we could follow our safeguarding procedures and get the children out quickly and safely. Thank you! It is also lovely for all the staff to hear your thanks on picking your children up – they volunteer their own time for these events and your kind words are very much appreciated.

All of the proceeds from this disco go towards providing fun activities for the children at Christmas. Thank you for your generous support. Now that November has begun, the children will start preparing for our Christmas events – slowly at first and gathering pace as we get closer to our Christmas performances.

The second source of much excitement this week has been Bonfire Night with children right across the school learning about Guy Fawkes, making firework patterns and pictures and learning about safety around fireworks. Cherry Class even lit sparklers as part of their life skills curriculum and practised how to be super safe with them. There was a lot of planning that went into enabling the children to do this – it was so worth it to see the children's delight!

All across the school, children have been starting their new units of work – it has been great to pop into classes and see their enthusiasm and engagement. In Maple Class children were showing our school values as they worked hard sewing their cushions and decorating them with cross stitch in DT lessons. The respect, kindness and inclusivity they demonstrated as they shared resources with each other was lovely to see while their ambition and resilience to master a new skill and keep going when the needle needed re-threading – again – were a credit to them. The class team are really proud of all the children and their cushions look amazing!

Next week, we have our parents' evening appointments which is your opportunity to find out about your child's time during the school day and what they are learning. You will have received a letter from your child's teacher asking you to sign up to SeeSaw if they are in Year 1 to 6.

For those of you who have had a child in Nursery or Reception, this is a similar app to Tapestry and provides a window into your child's experiences while they are at school and is only visible to families within your child's class. It is also a way for class teams to contact you with any information that you may need about upcoming events and important messages for the class. Please sign up for the app before parents' evening and complete the consent form for permission to add your child's image to SeeSaw –you can ask your child's teacher any questions you may have. Once we have all permissions and parents signed up, you will start to see posts that share your child's learning with you. Miss Crowe has been working really hard to set up ways for you to find out about what's happening in school. As well as SeeSaw, she has set up Facebook and Instagram pages to improve communication about events and experiences in school. These maps highlight safe walking routes, key crossings, and sustainable travel options to encourage pupils and parents to leave the car at home and choose active travel where possible.

Medical and dental appointments during school time.

Attending a medical or dental appointment will be counted as authorised as long as the pupil's parent notifies the school in advance of the appointment and show evidence of it, this could be an appointment card, text or letter to be given the school office. However, we encourage parents to make medical and dental appointments out of school hours where possible. Where this is not possible, the pupil should be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary.

Collection at the end of the day.

If for any reason you are unable to collect your child at the end of the day. Please phone the office to let us know the alternative arrangements. If the person who is collecting is not on the recognised "Pick up list" you may be asked for a password. These are measures to keep your child safe.
