As I watched each performance, I was struck by the progress that our children make as they move through school. From their very first speaking parts exploring how to use a microphone - to the Year 2 children who had learned their parts perfectly and delivered them so confidently - to the polished narrators in KS2 who spoke with such clarity and poise as they each told the Christmas Story in their different ways.

As usual, the singing was brilliant in every show and it was so lovely to see the pride in all of the children as they sparkled and shone on the stage. It made me stop for a short while and enjoy the magical time that Christmas is for our children and I know that I wasn't the only one who had an emotional moment or two as our school values of inclusivity, ambition and kindness shone through.

We had an additional performance in Golden Square on Thursday where it was lovely to see our choir performing some of their favourite Christmas songs for people who were out and about in Town. Their singing was beautiful! It was great to see the support of our community once again at this event.

None of the performances would have taken place without the creativity, dedication and hard work of the class teams working together to make it happen for our children or the support and reassurance that families provided to help the children to learn their songs and lines and be confident to take part. I love watching them spot a loved one in the audience: they love to share what they do in school with family and friends.

As you can see, last week's attendance has really dipped for most classes – there have been some really nasty bugs going around. I'm pleased to say that, as I'm writing this, I've checked this week's attendance and it seems to be on the up.

We are continuing to pay extra attention to good hand and respiratory hygiene. We are also making sure that we have good ventilation in school which is proven to help to prevent illnesses from spreading. I have sent out some messages from the DfE and the NHS this week about how to protect ourselves from the common viruses that are around at the moment and when to keep children at home if they are ill and when they should come to school. If you are unsure about whether your child should be in school, just ask and we will give you the most up to date advice.

If you need support with attendance, talk to us and we will work together to improve outcomes for our children.

The School Age Immunisation Team will return to the school on Thursday 8th January to provide flu vaccinations for pupils who were unable to receive them during the initial visit.
